The Missions Committee would like to introduce you to a couple that is going to be a new Communion Sunday recipient. Osias Segura-Guzman is a missionary with the General Board of Global Ministries of the United Methodist Church working with new churches in Central America, especially the Evangelical Methodist Church of Nicaragua and the United Methodist Mission in Honduras. He assists pastors and lay leaders in the development of a network of accountable leaders for small groups, facilitates training, helps to create small-group teaching resources, and strategizes with local leaders on ways to promote church growth.

Desiree L. Segura-April is also a missionary with the General Board of Global Ministries of the United Methodist Church serving as a resource person for the Children at Risk Ministries of the Evangelical Methodist Church of Nicaragua. This church is an outgrowth of several streams of mission work in the Central American country. Many participants are children and efforts are underway to expand ministries for children both in the churches and the larger communities.

Desiree and Osias met in Central America and eventually married. They have a son, Nikolas Gabriel, born in 2011. We had the opportunity to meet them in November and they will be coming back to do a potluck presentation in the fall of 2017. Lent begins with Ash Wednesday

Our service will be **MARCH 1st** at noon.

Lent is a season of the Christian Year when Christians focus on simple living, praying, and fasting in order to grow closer to God. Lent is the forty days before Easter. Lent excludes Sundays because every Sunday is like a little Easter. Basically, it's about one-tenth of a year (like a tithe of time).

Lent begins with a service on Ash Wednesday when we recognize our mortality, repent of our sins, and return to our loving God. We recognize life as a precious gift from God, and re-turn our lives towards Jesus Christ. We may make resolutions and commit to change our lives over the next forty days so that we might be more like Christ. In an Ash Wednesday service, usually a minister or priest marks the sign of the cross on a person's forehead with ashes.

You may be asking, "Why ashes?" In Jewish and Christian history, ashes are a sign of mortality and repentance. Mortality, because when we die, our bodies eventually decompose and we become dust/dirt/ash/whatever. Repentance, because long ago, when people felt remorse for something they did, they would put ashes on their head and wear "sackcloth" (scratchy clothing) to remind them that sin is pretty uncomfortable and leads to a sort of death of the spirit. This was their way of confessing their sins and asking for forgiveness.

Now you may be wondering where the ashes come from. On what we now call Palm Sunday, Jesus rode a donkey into Jerusalem while people waved palms and cheered him on. Less than a week later, Jesus was killed. The palms that were waved in joy became ashes of sorrow. We get ashes for Ash Wednesday by saving the palms from Palm Sunday, burning them, and mixing them with a little water (like tears) or oil. It's symbolic.

At an Ash Wednesday service, folks are invited to come forward to receive the ashes. The minister will make a small cross on your forehead by smudging the ashes. While the ashes remind us of our mortality and sin, the cross reminds us of Jesus' resurrection (life after death) and forgiveness. It's a powerful, non-verbal way that we can experience God's forgiveness and renewal as we return to Jesus.

At Jesus' baptism, the sky split open. The Spirit of God, which looked like a dove, descended and landed on Jesus. A voice from heaven said, "This is my Son, My Beloved, with whom I am pleased." Afterward, as told in Matthew 4:1-11, Jesus was sent into the wilderness by the Spirit where he fasted and prayed for 40 days. During his time there, he was tempted by Satan and found clarity and strength to resist temptation. Afterwards, he was ready to begin his ministry. After our forty days of Lent, we are once again ready to celebrate the Risen Christ on Easter and go forth to minister to God's world.

LENTEN OFFERING FOR SUN CITY CAN (Community Assistance Network)

It's that time of year again for the "loose coins" collection. You can start collecting those coins in tin cans to bring on Easter Sunday. Sun City CAN is a non-profit charity. Their mission is to connect people with resources to help our residents. Volunteer counselors assist low income residents apply for federal, state and local programs. This includes utility discounts, prescription drugs, food stamps, Medicare help, Social Security assistance, tax help, and more. The 2010 census states the 6.5% of Sun City's population is below the poverty line. That is about 2,500 of our neighbors, mainly elderly widows. They help over 400 people each year. Sun City CAN's office is located behind Sun Valley Lodge at 10195 Coggins Drive. Their only source of income is from the annual donations. All services are free.



Our Lenten Offering will support Sun City CAN. We are asking you to wash out a tin can and collect all your spare coins. Bring your can to worship on Easter Sunday, April 16th. The Missions Committee thanks you in advance for your support of this project.

Transportation Services in Sun City & Northwest Valley

Benevilla: Phone 623-584-4999. Ask for "Intake Services." They offer a free once-a-week transportation ride or \$20.00 per ride if more. You must call 7 to 10 days prior to the appointment.

Care from the Heart: Phone 623-875-4440. The cost is \$0.58 per mile. Call and they will send someone to evaluate a person's needs.

Discount Cab: Phone 602-200-2000. The cost is \$2.25 for first mile then \$2.95 per mile thereafter.

Valley Metro is the Green Discount Cab: (Sun City version of "Dial-a-Ride") Phone: 602-266-8723. The cost within Sun City is \$4.00 each way. Cash only. A person can call 3 days in advance; but, must call at least 1 day before the appointment. The driver will have 1/2 hour leeway to arrive. Each city; i.e., Peoria, Surprise, have different charges.

Northwest Valley Connect: Phone 623-282-9300. This is a call center that searches data for transportation requests to doctors, groceries, any transportation. (There is a fee and it does not restrict users by age, need, purpose or time of day for a ride.)

SCAN (Sun City Area Network): Phone 623-933-7530. This agency offers a few free rides for persons with limited income.





MARIAN THOMPSON MEMORIAL FUND

One beautiful Sunday morning, a preacher announced to her congregation: “My good people, I have here in my hands three sermons...a \$100 sermon that lasts five minutes, a \$50 sermon that lasts fifteen minutes, and a \$10 sermon that lasts a full hour. Now, we’ll take the collection and see which one I’ll deliver.”

The year of 2016 is over. It has been an important time for the Marian Thompson Memorial Fund giving. All through the year, we have had people giving small and not so small amounts to this very important fund. The amount that any one individual has given did not determine the length of a sermon or any other return to the donor. It only showed how that person loved the church and wanted to help the future direction we take so that our First United Methodist Church will remain viable.
