BLESSING OF THE PETS

The time of Lent is a time of repentance, letting go of the things that keep us from a full relationship with God. When people give up something for Lent (for example chocolate), every time they think of the item, it is a reminder to pray. Through our prayers, we grow closer to God. This has me thinking about different types or styles of prayer, two of which I wanted to share with you here...

Breath Prayers are simple prayers. Short. Easy. They can be spoken in a single breath and repeated numerous times throughout the day. The habit of “breath prayers” can make a huge difference in your life as they help you to “pray without ceasing” (1 Thessalonians 5:17). Christians have used breath prayers for centuries. As Rick Warren described it in *“The Purpose-Driven Life,”* “You choose a brief sentence or a simple phrase that can be repeated in one breath... Pray it as often as possible so it is rooted deep in your heart.”

Centering Prayer is an acknowledgement that God is always with us, but we are not always with God. Through centering prayer, we intend to remove the barriers we might have between God and ourselves and “rest in Him.” The 16th century mystic St. John of the Cross described silence as “God’s first language.” God’s language is His presence. When we immerse ourselves in silence is when we can truly be with God, as God is – not how we want Him to be, not how we think He should be. God just is and we are just with God. As we try to achieve the place of silence, thoughts, emotions or memories often come into our mind. Silently repeat a sacred word you have chosen such as Peace, Abba, Jesu or Amen. This is a way of saying, “Right now, I want to be with God. Come back later.”

There are a few things about prayer that we need to be aware of to have an effective prayer life. First you must show up; be consistent and regular in your prayers. Eighty percent of success is just showing up. Simply turn your attention to God; that is the beginning of prayer, and it is often the great majority of it as well. Next you need to know the soul that prays, trusts. The soul that trusts, prays. Wherever you are, remind yourself that God is there. Believe that He is listening. Remember that He is good and loving, and that He knows what you need before you even begin to pray. It may take time and practice before you can differentiate between the voice of God and the voices in your own head, but it is well worth it to try. This is why silence and solitude are so conducive to prayer; they help us develop listening skills...the third step in prayer. Finally, remember “your Father knows what you need before you ask Him” (Matthew 6:8). Like children before a loving father, we open our hearts and make our requests. We do not try to sort things out, the good from the bad. We simply and unpretentiously share our concerns and make our petitions.

I’ve found that the more I work on my prayer life, the more I realize a sense of God’s presence in my life. And isn’t that what Lent is all about?

It's that time of year again for the "loose coins" collection. You can start collecting those coins in tin cans to bring on Easter Sunday. Sun City CAN is a non-profit charity. Their mission is to connect people with resources to help our residents. Volunteer counselors assist low income residents apply for federal, state and local programs. This includes utility discounts, prescription drugs, food stamps, Medicare help, Social Security assistance, tax help, and more. The 2010 census states that the 6.5% of Sun City's population is below the poverty line. That is about 2,500 of our neighbors, mainly elderly widows. Sun City CAN helps over 400 people each year. Their office is located behind Sun Valley Lodge at 10195 Coggins Drive. Their only source of income is from the annual donations. All services are free.

Members come from a wide array of musical backgrounds – from professionally-trained voices, to former musical teachers, choir members, and ladies who simply love to sing four-part harmony. Most members live in Sun City but there are also women who come from Sun City West, Surprise, and Peoria.



Lent begins with Ash Wednesday

Our service will be **MARCH 1st at noon.**

Lent is a season of the Christian Year when Christians focus on simple living, praying, and fasting in order to grow closer to God. Lent is the forty days before Easter. Lent excludes Sundays because every Sunday is like a little Easter. Basically, it's about one-tenth of a year (like a tithe of time).

Lent begins with a service on Ash Wednesday when we recognize our mortality, repent of our sins, and return to our loving God. We recognize life as a precious gift from God, and re-turn our lives towards Jesus Christ. We may make resolutions and commit to change our lives over the next forty days so that we might be more like Christ. In an Ash Wednesday service, usually a minister or priest marks the sign of the cross on a person's forehead with ashes.

You may be asking, "Why ashes?" In Jewish and Christian history, ashes are a sign of mortality and repentance. Mortality, because when we die, our bodies eventually decompose and we become dust/dirt/ash/whatever. Repentance, because long ago, when people felt remorse for something they did, they would put ashes on their head and wear "sackcloth" (scratchy clothing) to remind them that sin is pretty uncomfortable and leads to a sort of death of the spirit. This was their way of confessing their sins and asking for forgiveness.

Now you may be wondering where the ashes come from. On what we now call Palm Sunday, Jesus rode a donkey into Jerusalem while people waved palms and cheered him on. Less than a week later, Jesus was killed. The palms that were waved in joy became ashes of sorrow. We get ashes for Ash Wednesday by saving the palms from Palm Sunday, burning them, and mixing them with a little water (like tears) or oil. It's symbolic.

At an Ash Wednesday service, folks are invited to come forward to receive the ashes. The minister will make a small cross on your forehead by smudging the ashes. While the ashes remind us of our mortality and sin, the cross reminds us of Jesus' resurrection (life after death) and forgiveness. It's a powerful, non-verbal way that we can experience God's forgiveness and renewal as we return to Jesus.

At Jesus' baptism, the sky split open. The Spirit of God, which looked like a dove, descended and landed on Jesus. A voice from heaven said, "This is my Son, My Beloved, with whom I am pleased." Afterward, as told in Matthew 4:1-11, Jesus was sent into the wilderness by the Spirit where he fasted and prayed for 40 days. During his time there, he was tempted by Satan and found clarity and strength to resist temptation. Afterwards, he was ready to begin his ministry. After our forty days of Lent, we are once again ready to celebrate the Risen Christ on Easter and go forth to minister to God's world.

Transportation Services in Sun City & Northwest Valley

Benevilla: Phone 623-584-4999. Ask for "Intake Services." They offer a free once-a-week transportation ride or \$20.00 per ride if more. You must call 7 to 10 days prior to the appointment.

Care from the Heart: Phone 623-875-4440. The cost is \$0.58 per mile. Call and they will send someone to evaluate a person's needs.

Discount Cab: Phone 602-200-2000. The cost is \$2.25 for first mile then \$2.95 per mile thereafter.

Valley Metro is the Green Discount Cab: (Sun City version of "Dial-a-Ride")
Phone: 602-266-8723. The cost within Sun City is \$4.00 each way. Cash only. A person can call 3 days in advance; but, must call at least 1 day before the appointment. The driver will have 1/2 hour leeway to arrive. Each city; i.e., Peoria, Surprise, have different charges.

Northwest Valley Connect: Phone 623-282-9300. This is a call center that searches data for transportation requests to doctors, groceries, any transportation. (There is a fee and it does not restrict users by age, need, purpose or time of day for a ride.)

SCAN (Sun City Area Network): Phone 623-933-7530. This agency offers a few free rides for persons with limited income.
