2017 Annual Conference Lay Member Report

This year's conference focused upon "The Initiative For Growth and Vitality" for the churches of the Desert Southwest Conference. The vision being: "A Courageous Church: Loving Like Jesus, Acting For Justice and United In Hope."

There were 5 "holy huddles." These took place at the tables where everyone was seated. There were multiple churches represented at each table and the answers we came up with for each table are being compiled and will be made available to all.

The first huddle focused upon our "values." For example, what would it look like if God showed up in all that we do in our ministry?

The second one discussed what is the most courageous thing our church has done to be loving like Jesus?

The third one came from the District Superintendents (Missional Strategists) and covered the 4 things they will be focusing on for each church.

The fourth huddle concerned the courageous church acting for justice. If resources were not an obstacle, what injustice would we act courageously to end? Or, what are some steps we could take to begin this process, etc.?

The fifth huddle asked what does it feel like to be a courageous church united in hope? Does the accomplishing of these things give your church a feeling of being united in hope?

On Saturday afternoon, Bishop Schnase lectured on his book "*Just Say Yes.*" This topic dealt with the destructive power of "no" when people want to participate in the church. The most important part of this, in my opinion, was that a person should be asked what they see as their ministry and help them become involved; don't just ask them what committee they want to be on.

Message from the Pastor

There are almost always things going on around us that can cause us to become distracted. This is especially true if there is something you really do not want to do in your home or office. I remember once when my children were little, I needed to mop the kitchen floor, which was not my favorite task. I moved the stove and refrigerator to polish them and clean under before doing all the floors. Then I cleaned the cabinet doors, and while I was there all the shelves and relined them. Then I scrubbed down all the counter tops as well as cleaned all the spice jars. In the end, I still had to mop the floor. Despite all the other things I did, the floor did not clean itself.

I shake my head as I read that story. It is true, and I still do other things – sometimes important things needing to be done – to keep from doing something I do not like to do. I am not actually wasting time, but I am probably not making the best use of my time either. One of my friends told me the other day that they can find more ways to fritter away time... At least I know that I am not alone with my dilemma.

There is a short story I have read several times about people starting to do something and stopping to do something else real quick then going off in another direction to again be distracted for a moment – none of the things are actually done, but thought of and moved on from once another thing comes to mind. We all have or read about stories like this. They give us a good laugh.

This is not quite as amusing when it distracts me from doing my daily Bible Study and devotionals. While I may serve as a pastor of a local church, I am also a person with all the same issues and distractions, likes and dislikes as anyone else. In my personal experience, it was very eye-opening to discover that ministers were people too. (Sounds silly, but it is true!) So, daily I have to carve out time to read God's Word and the devotionals I am using this year.

One way I have tried to help myself keep distractions at a minimum is I have a place in my home where I go daily to spend special time with God, read, meditate, and pray. I keep pen and paper there so when those other things come floating into my mind, I write them down so I do not forget and then I can stay focused on my holy time. We can pray and connect with God anytime and anywhere, but this is special time set aside.

It is important that we have daily time with God. Read the Upper Room; find a daily devotional book you enjoy. Choose a book of the Bible to read and study. Pray. The quiet time you take and spend with God will benefit you in many other areas of your life. Do not get distracted, Just Do It!

Starter Kits

When one of their members gets housed after an extended period of homelessness, they often must start over completely. As part of Justa Center's Extended Care Program, they help them begin again with a Starter Kit, which includes items that allow them to get settled into their new home. **Their members are very often moving into their new home by themselves, so they are seeking small, light furniture items that can be moved by one person, i.e. twin beds, folding tables and chairs, cots, etc.** They estimate that the Starter Kit is valued at approximately \$250. Justa Center receives no financial aid or assistance from federal, state or local governments, so these items are made available only through special donations from their supporters.

Families at UMOM have the opportunity to gain the skills, medical care, quality child care, and education they need to rebuild their lives and succeed when they leave.
