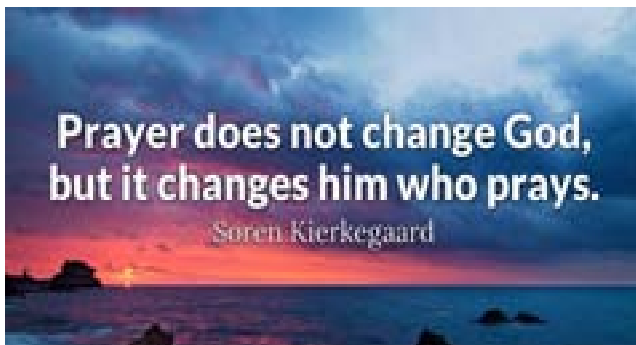

## *Message from the Pastor*

God is always faithful. God does not come chasing us, but is always there waiting for us to turn to Him. I was thinking about how God works in our lives and decided it is not the way most of us are used to things working...

In the world in which we live, we are constantly being bombarded with all kinds of advertisements and opportunities for self-improvement. When we watch programs on television, we almost have more commercials than programs... There are soaps for clothes, hair, body, cars, dishes (both by hand and in the machine), floors, bathrooms, and oh-my-gosh, the list could go on and on. We are told what to drink, what to eat, what to see at the theater, what clothes to wear, where to shop, where to invest, where to borrow; the advertisers will tell us exactly how to live our lives if we listen to them.

Then there are the phone calls! Everyone seems to be calling to try to encourage us about something... I ran a quick little survey on Facebook to see what kind of solicitation calls people were receiving and they ran the gamut. I made a list of over 30 items! This is unbelievable. There are so many "opportunities" coming at us all the time from all directions. It is no wonder we often do not hear the "still small voice" of God. (Also referred to as "a gentle whisper" depending on the translation, I Kings 19:12.)

All of this may lead some to ask how we can hear God's voice today in the busy and noisy world in which we live. God can speak to us through His word. 2 Timothy 3:16 says that all scripture is "God-Breathed." His Word sometimes gives us a warning, encouragement, or a lesson for life. The New Testament is the Good News of Jesus Christ. Through the words of Jesus in scripture, we can "hear" God's heart and God's voice. This is how we find out what God is truly like.

Through nature and all of God's creation, we can "hear" His voice. By observing the ant's strength to store up food all summer long, we learn about industriousness and wisdom. By studying the heavens, we understand more of God's greatness. Through planting and growing, we "hear" about miracles of death and rebirth.

We can "hear" God through other believers. God may use a friend, a teacher, a parent, or a preacher to convey His message of truth to us. Their words may come as a warning, a blessing, or as a prophetic truth about our lives. Whether we choose to hear it or ignore it depends on us. Words from a speaker or Christian author have both challenged me and convicted me at times.

Often I "hear" God through music. Music, with or without lyrics, affects my spirit. There are a many great quotes about music, but I think the following anonymous one expresses what I am trying to convey the best: "Music speaks what cannot be expressed, soothes the mind and gives it rest; heals the heart and makes it whole, flows from heaven to the soul."

God is faithful, listening for us to reach out in prayer. God is faithful to respond to us as we see and listen to the myriad of ways that God is responding to our needs. Some days I need a two-by-four to get my attention and others a gentle breeze will bring me once again to the realization God is here. I am not alone. I am loved. So are You.

## SHOEBOX FOR OPERATION CHRISTMAS CHILD

Our church will again prepare shoeboxes for Samaritan's Purse. Franklin Graham (Billy Graham's son), is the president of this organization. In addition to hearing the Gospel BEFORE they receive their shoebox gift, children also receive The Greatest Gift, a story book that shares the message of salvation. The booklet shares 11 scripture stories and invites children to follow Christ. They then take this book home to share with their families. It is used in more than 80 languages. There are year-round local volunteers from various evangelical denominations who know the culture and language that can communicate the Gospel with their own communities. After receiving a shoebox, children have the opportunity to enroll in The Greatest Journey, their 12-lesson Bible student course guiding them through what it means to faithfully follow Christ. Just \$6 (which comes from donations) provides a child with Bible study materials, a New Testament in their own language, and a graduation certificate. Since 2009 more than 6.9 million children have reported decisions for Christ. When the children attend the Bible classes, many parents become curious and attend also.

The dedication for these boxes is October 7th which is also World Communion Sunday. This gives you all plenty of time to find those bargains and be done before the busy holidays. A LIST OF ARTICLES AS TO WHAT TO PUT IN AND NOT PUT IN THE BOXES WILL BE TAPED TO THE TABLE BY THE BOXES. THERE WILL ALSO BE A PAMPHLET "How to pack your shoebox" with the same information to take home. If you want to put a check in your box for \$9 (yes, it's gone up) to cover the shipping cost, that would be great. Again the Missions Committee would like to thank the congregation for always supporting these missions. You are faithful!

## September's Communion Offering to Support Justa Center



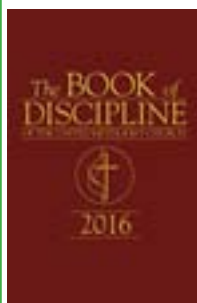
Justa Center is a day resource center only for homeless seniors (over the age of 55). Approximately 55% of the people seeking help are veterans. They staff resource specialists who help client members to re-establish their documents and IDs and even have a special veterans advocate. The Center provides seniors with necessary services from safe housing, nutrition assistance, basic physical healthcare, substance abuse care, aftercare, mental health counseling, personal development, job assessment and placement assistance. On any given day, more than 120 homeless seniors visit Justa Center. More than 1,200 have been moved into independent housing. Justa Center employs social workers and counselors for an Extended Care Program to assist our friends after they move into housing. Justa Center provides them a safe place to stay during the day as many seniors are targets while living on the streets. The homeless seniors can take showers, have laundry done for them and Justa Center also has a clothing closet. The staff does from 15 to 50 loads of laundry a day. There is an RN on site 6 days a week.



## World Communion Sunday

Part of the point of World Communion Sunday is to recognize the many and various ways Christians around the globe celebrate the same ritual. On this Sunday (October 7th), your giving helps to provide scholarships for gifted and qualified people in the U.S. racial and ethnic students and international students on both undergraduate and graduate levels. Statistics show that the majority of clergy and laity is white. As U.S. demographics continue to change, the church must prepare leaders to serve an increasingly diverse population.

Fifty percent of the offering provides Crusade Scholarships for international and U.S. racial and ethnic graduate students. Thirty-five percent of receipts support Ethnic Scholarships for undergraduates. Fifteen percent funds Ethnic Minority In-Service Training Program Scholarships for racial and ethnic persons seeking second careers in church-related vocations. These scholarships are exactly what the church needs to fulfill its global mission.
